



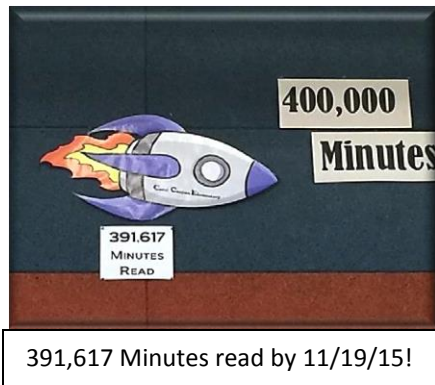
## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE:

### From the Reading Specialist:

When kids are reading, we often jump in to make corrections very quickly. Try just waiting to see if they correct themselves. You will be surprised at the number of times they make changes without your help, and it will give them more confidence in their ability as a reader to do it on their own. When a child is stuck on an unknown word, help him think of a meaningful fit and to look at details in the word to help solve it. The most important goal is to understand what is being read and develop a real enjoyment for reading!
