Title I Notes:

Preschool – Through Title I funds, Coral Canyon Elementary is able to have an outstanding Preschool. Most studies show that children in a language rich environment learn over 4,000 new words between the ages of four and five. At this time, we still have a few open spots in our Preschool. If you are interested in having your 4 year old attend our Preschool or would like more information, please give our secretaries a call at 652-4787.

We are also very fortunate to have a **Before and After School Intervention Program** at our school. Students are able to utilize our **Waterford** and **SuccessMaker** Program. **Waterford** is designed for the lower grades, K – 2, while **SuccessMaker** is designed for upper grades, 3 – 5. Each program individualizes instruction based on the student's learning level. Students are supported with additional instruction, helpful tools, and targeted practice.

The SuccessMaker/Waterford lab is available in the morning from 8 a.m. to 8:40 a.m. Monday through Friday OR after school Monday through Thursday from 3:35 p.m. to 4:15 p.m. Parents or guardians are responsible for transportation. If your child has breakfast at school, s/he will be excused in time to go and eat breakfast.
